

New Yolumes That Will Change Your View Of Present Wars

In 1973 I published a book that dealt with a critical misunderstanding of Bible prophecy, which misunderstanding prevails even to this day in a misguided world view. The premise of the book was based on thousands of people around the world at the time who claimed to know Jesus. However, they denied Him because of their view of Old Testament prophecies. Their view was that Jesus had not fulfilled all the Old Testament prophecies concerning His incarnation and establishment of His kingdom reign as He claimed at the conclusion of His ministry in the flesh in Luke 24:44. On the contrary, these prognosticators taught that Jesus came in the flesh to His own—the Jews—but those Jews at the time of His first coming rejected Him as the incarnation of God in the flesh. Subsequently, Jesus supposedly postponed His earthly kingdom reign until a later time when He would come again to establish forcefully a kingdom on this earth. Until that time, God would supposedly work in the selfproclaimed Jews on earth to organize themselves in order to produce a restored Jewish nation over which Jesus could reign when He comes again. They would free the land of Palestine of all "unbelievers" so Jesus could reincarnate in the flesh and set up His earthly kingdom. Thousands of people around the world today have been deceived into believing this erroneous world view. They have been led to believe that all the existing wars in the Middle East today are in preparation for Jesus to come again and establish a kingdom in Palestine—a most carnal and worldly concept of Jesus' kingdom reign.

The problem with the preceding deception of an earthly kingdom reign of Jesus is in the fact that those who believe this **do not now really know Jesus**. Over two thousand years ago the apostle Paul wrote the statement that follows. It is as applicable today as it was when the ink dried at the time the Holy Spirit guided him to write it over two thousand years ago:

Therefore, from now on we know no man according to the flesh. Even though we have known Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know Him thus no more (2 Corinthians 5:16 - Be careful with corrupted translations of this verse).

The Son of God indeed was incarnate in the flesh of humanity over two thousand years ago. People personally walked with and knew Him "in the flesh." But after His resurrection, and then in His ascension to the right hand of the Father, He was no longer in the flesh. He is now King of kings and Lord of Lord, reigning over the galaxies, Satan, angels and all world powers being subject to him (See Ephesian 1:20-23; 1 Peter 3:22). Those who do not know King Jesus after this manner, do not at this time know Jesus. They seek for Him to be incarnate again in the flesh of a human in order that they might know Him according to the flesh. Those "believers" who seek that the Jews win the exisitng war in preparation for the reincarnation of King Jesus, do not really know Jesus as He now is. When He does return again, He will return all His existing galactic reign to God (1 Corinthians 15:28).

The first research that I did on this subject was published as a hardback, but now the book is on the Internet.
